Day 1 - Depart early morning and travel to your overnight stop in Cleveland, OH for check-in (pack an overnight bag); dinner is on your own this evening.

Day 2 -Enjoy breakfast, then check out and depart for a visit to the **Rock 'N' Roll Hall of Fame**. After your visit, travel to Detroit where you will visit the **Motown Museum - Hitsville USA** where many of your favorite artists and groups recorded their music and where Berry Gordy lived in the early days of his company. The museum houses an extensive array of Motown artifacts, photographs and other memorabilia. After your visit, continue traveling to our northern neighbor, Canada. Your destination is **Windsor, Ontario** which is known as "The City of Roses". It is located at the southernmost part of Canada which is separated from the United States by the Detroit River, across from Detroit. Upon arrival you will check into **Caesar's Windsor Hotel & Casino**, a four-diamond hotel in the downtown district. After freshening up, you will enjoy a fabulous dinner at the **Market Place Buffet**. The rest of the evening is at your leisure.

Day 3 – After breakfast (\$15 meal voucher included), depart for a **5-hour tour of Windsor**. During the tour, eight costumed characters will tell the story of prohibition and bootlegging in Windsor and Detroit during the Roaring Twenties. Benny da Weasel will guide you until the police show up and Benny skips out on you to avoid being caught. Learn the secrets used by bootleggers to smuggle liquor across the Detroit River. Visit one of the famous riverfront roadhouses where you will be greeted by the legendary Bertha Thomas who served many notorious gangsters at her very popular Edgewater Inn. Taste Canada's most famous whiskey at the historic **Canadian Club Heritage Center.** Meet the colorful King Canada who used to ship liquor daily to Al Capone in Chicago. Visit the church made famous by The Fighting Parson and meet the gun-toting Methodist Minister. You will learn how everyday people like taxi drivers and newspaper vendors became wealthy entrepreneurs. Lunch will be served at one of the famous haunts. Return to the casino for a free evening of trying your hand at the slot machines or table games. Dinner is on your own at one of the five restaurants located at the casino.

Day 4 - Following breakfast (\$15 meal voucher included), meet your guide for an unforgettable tour of "The Road That Led to Freedom". Thousands of enslaved and free African Americans crossed the Detroit River from the U.S. to Canada to live as free citizens in Canada. You will follow the region's Underground Railroad as it traces the perilous path of those seeking freedom. The Underground Railroad sites include the Sandwich First Baptist Church (built by hand with Detroit River clay by slaves escaping and free Blacks as payment for a meal and safe haven), the North American Black Historical Museum, and the John Freeman Walls Historic Site & Underground Railroad Museum where you will meet descendants of the Underground Railroad and conductors who will take you on an interactive and informative trip back into time. Your tour will end with a visit to the North Buxton National Historic Site which sits on the original property purchased by Josiah Henson to establish a refuge for fugitives. The novel, "Uncle Tom's Cabin", was based on Henson's memoirs. Later in the afternoon you will enjoy a scenic cruise on the Detroit River. As you sail past Canada's shoreline, you will view the beautiful waterfront and hear about the history of Hiram Walker and Prohibition. This evening dinner will be on your own.

Day 5 – Enjoy breakfast (\$15 meal voucher included), then check out and depart for home ... taking with you lasting memories of your trip to Windsor, Ontario.
